SAN FRANCISCO. CALIFORNIA. The Alaska Salmon Catch.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 9. - The schooner Comet is at present dis-charging 5,000 cases of salmon, packed at Chignik bay, Alaska, by the Choumagin Island Packing company. brig Courtney was expected to leave on September 1, with 5,000 cases. She left the Portland, Mary Flick inger, and Katy Winkelman in port.

Captain Lass confirms the former report of light packs this season; but as the packers still had two months' work before them, they were not dis-couraged. Up to July 27, the Chou-magin Island company had put up 7,000 cases, the Chignik Bay Packing company 6,000 cases.

Regarding the pack at other points in Alaska, Captain Lass states that the Russian American Packing company, at Afognak island, has packed about 8,500 cases, and that Pollock Dodge at the same place has salted down only 250 barrels. The reports from Copper river were not encouraging. At Karluk the pack at the Alaska Commercial company's cannery, up to July 25, was about 17,000 cases, and that of the Aleutian Island Packing company, at Kodiak, about 10,000 cases. 
