The Alaska Salmon Catch.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 9.—The schooner *Comet* is at present discharging 5,000 cases of salmon, packed at Chignik bay, Alaska, by the Choumagin Island Packing company. When the *Comet* left, the brig *Courtney* was expected to leave for this port on the same afternoon, with 7,000 cases and the bark *Madoc* on September 1, with 5,000 cases. She left the *Portland*, *Mary Flickinger*, and *Katy Winkelman* in port.

Captain Lass confirms the former report of light packs this season; but as the packers still had two months' work before them, they were not discouraged. Up to July 27, the Choumagin Island company had put up 7,000 cases, the Chignik Bay Packing company 6,000 cases.

Regarding the pack at other points in Alaska, Captain Lass states that the Russian American Packing company, at Afognak island, has packed about 8,500 cases, and that Pollock Dodge at the same place has salted down only 250 barrels. The reports from Copper river were not encouraging. At Karluk the pack at the Alaska Commercial company's cannery, up to July 25, was about 17,000 cases, and that of the Aleutian Island Packing company, at Kodiak, about 10,000 cases. The Alaska Improvement company, at Karluk, has packed 9,000 cases.

At its intersection with Jefferson street, at a height of 23 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with Astor street, at a height of 25 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with Court street, at a height of 48 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 7th street at a height of 78 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 8th street, at a height of 108 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 9th street, at a height of 138 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 10th street, at a height of 168 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 11th street, at a height of 198 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 12th street, at a height of 228 feet above said base of grades.

At its intersection with 13th street, at a height of 258 feet above said base of grades.

And unless a remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property fronting on said street be filed with the Auditor and Police Judge within ten days after the final publication of this notice, to wit: on or before Friday, August 20th, 1889, the Common Council will establish such grade.
