It has become somewhat common nowadays to see the word "limited," in parenthesis, after the titles of corporations, and it is safe to say that people generally do not understand the significance of this term, though, of course business men do. An explanation of it, as stated in one of our exchanges, may, therefore, be of general interest. The old principal of corporations created by legislative act was that the entire property of every stockholder was liable for the whole of the company, as the whole property of every member of a general partnership is still liable for the debts of the firm. This system made every shareholder responsible for bad management, of which he might not be guilty, and deterred wealthy men from becoming interested in the shares of corporations. To remove this objection the principle of limited responsibility was introduced, and in order to notify the public that only the separate property of the corporation was liable for the debts of the corporation, the English law requires that the word Key, on the Bahama coast.
