PORTLAND, Aug. 20.—The steamer Mountain Queen was taken to Ash street dock to-day, where her furnishing was removed. She was stripped clean of everything prior to her being placed in the hands of the builders.

The case of William Basquell against the British ship City of Carlisle was settled this morning, the court allowing plaintiff \$1,500 damages. The vessel, it will be remembered, arrived in Portland last March.
