

Hops in Polk County.

INDEPENDENCE, Ore., Sept. 1.—The importance of the hop industry in the vicinity of this town is manifested in the fact that enough hop pickers could not be had here, so hands were secured from Portland, and the result is that there is a scarcity of laboring men here now. This year's crop will not be quite up to the yield of last year, but the quality is better. There are nearly fifty hop yards in Polk county, and in two of these 225 pick-ers will find work. Some yards are yielding 2000 rounds to the area yielding 3,000 pounds to the acre, though the average is 1,500 pounds.
