"In several instances I saw slave children sold whose veins contained so much of their master's blood that their skins were without a tinge of the African color except in the invariable stripe down the spinal col-umn. haps you don't know that a negro child at its birth is as light colored as a white one. You wouldn't notice any difference in the color at all. In three or four hours after birth the skin begins to turn dark, and in a short time becomes as black as the child is destined to be during its life." —Interview in Indianapolis News.
