THE "FIERY CROSS" WINS. News has just been received here of the arrival at Queenstown of the British ship Fiery Cross. There would be nothing remarkable in that fact were it not that her captain had made a bet of \$500 with the master of the British ship Hornby Castle which sailed from Astoria the same day with the Fiery Cross, and that he would beat him to their home port.

OVERWORKED CLERKS STRIKE. Chief clerk W. T. Henry of the railway postal service left this morning on instructions received from Washington for Spokane Falls. His trip was occasioned by the fact that a strike has been instigated at the postoffice there by the clerks, who decline to work more than a few days longer on account of short pay, long hours and overwork.

A FRANKIE BLAZE. LAG QUI PARLE, Minn., Sept. 6.—A prairie fire ten miles wide is sweeping the Minnesota bottom-lands, and the town of Big Stone City is threatened with destruction, the flames having reached a point two miles southeast of there.
