RAINEY'S RAZZLE DAZZLE.

But He Failed to Down the Astorians. Who Returns in Triumph This Morning. Tacoma, Sept. 19, '89. The 1889 tournament of the northwestern firemen's association is over, and the visitors to-night shake from their shoes the dust of Tacoma, those from Astoria returning not as sheep who were shorn, but as victors with scamps at their belts.

AS SOON AS HE SUBSIDED. Peace spread her snowy wings, and harmony reigned supreme. Mr. Barbank, the gentlemanly and efficient secretary of the association, who had been in a most difficult and delicate position, came to the front and on behalf of the Tacoma fire department and the citizens of that enterprising city, thanked the Astorians for the prizes which were honored by warrants from him in accordance with the decisions of the judges.

All Astoria had asked at any time was fair show, and an equal chance with the other eleven teams in competing for the various contests. Yesterday, to secure peace, it became necessary to fight for it. In self defense, one of the visitors, Tom Linnell, struck a big bully of a policeman.

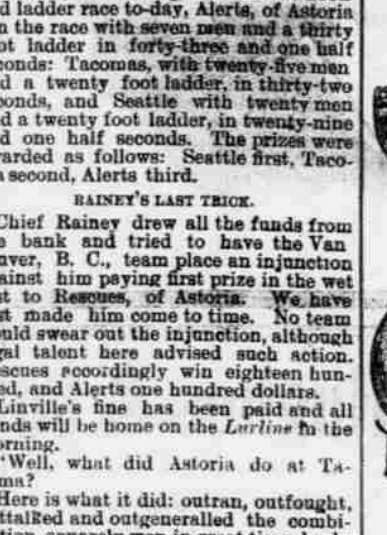
