Shot In The Arm.
GERVAIS, Or., Sept. 22.—Thomas Winning, a young Englishman, 21 years of age, lately from California, who has been working for F. X. Mason, about one and one-half miles east of Brooks, went out hunting this morning, and while returning home was shot by some unknown party or parties, who were hid in the brush, the charge taking effect in the right arm, making a very large and dangerous wound. After being shot he cried for help and said he was shot. Then the parties, who were about 150 yards distant, fired again, taking effect in the back. He was brought to this city and his wounds are being dressed by Dr. Stott, who pronounces them quite critical. No reason is assigned for the shooting.
