WHEN war comes in Europe, as it must come some time, it will be seen The civil war in the United States was but child's play in comparison. With Fredericksburg in the war is thought Russia and France on one side and to be the cause. Germany, Austria and Italy on the other, seven millions of men can be instantly put in the field, with ten millions in reserve. The facilities for concentration and the improved arms are such that more men may be easily killed in one day than have ever before been killed in a whole war. The continuous preparations for war, even when there is no thought of its immediste occurrence, are far greater and more expensive than ever before. France has surrounded her frontiers and her capital with a continuous line of forts and entrenchments. Germany has made Metz, Strasburg, Mayence and Cologne gigantic fortresses, which seem absolutely impregnable. Italy has fortified her Alpine passes, her seaports, and even the Eternal city itself. Belgum is spending 40,000,000 f in the construction of and gavelit to my children, with the most sufficiently results. redoubts, with cupolas of steel, to close the passage by the Maas valley. national banks were increased to about \$60,000,000. The money is being applied as rapidly as possible to the purchase of outstanding bonds, extinguishment of the national debt, and the application of the money to the purchase of bonds in the open market is so greatly in excess of the reduction of the loans to the national banks, that no fear can possibly be entertained in any quarter, that the calling in of the loans will distress or affect the money market. It may affect the volume of the operating funds of a few national banks, but it cannot, in the least degree, make an impression upon the circulating medium of the country.
