And unless a remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property fronting on said portion of said street be filed with the Auditor and "olice Judge within ten days of the final publication of this notice, to wit: on or before Tuesday, November 12th, 1889, the Common Council will order said im-provement to be made.
