He entered the naval service in 1816 and resigned in 1853. August Belmont came to this country fifty years ago as the agent of the Rothschilds. He soon took a leading part in financial and social circles. He married the youngest daughter of Commodore M. C. Perry. Mr. Bel-mont's original name was Schoonlerg, which he Frenchified into Belmont after he immigrated into the United States. He was for many years a pat ron of the turf, but he has long since ceased to run horses. He was also a patron of art, but he no longer buys under the Buchanan administration, and president of the Democratic convention that nominated Horace Gree ley in 1872.
