Salmon and Sturgeon Fishing.

Salmon fishing is prosecuted in the Columbia and its tributaries all the year round.

The season for taking Chinook salmon is fixed by law from the first of April to the 1st of August.

After this the silverides fishing begins. This year there has been a great many of these fish caught, especially in the Cowlitz river, from which many tons have been shipped here.

The run of silverides is now about over, and they are followed by the steelheads, which are now in the river.

A fisherman was met by a reporter yesterday in his net and twine dealer's, making a purchase of nets for the steelhead fishing.

In answer to inquiries, he said the steelhead fishing would last till March, when it would be at its best, but, unfortunately, March was a close month. He has been examining the Clatskanie for a place to establish a fishery, but says it is hard stream to fish in, swift and shallow—and where there are long deep pools they are taken up. The steelheads are caught principally in the Willamette below the falls of the Clatskanie. They used to be plentiful in the Cowlitz, but not many are caught there now.

The steelhead is a better fish than the silverides, and is a favorite in the New York market, being a firm fish and standing shipping well. They used to sell here five years ago for \$2.50 per dozen, but bring a much better price now.

When asked if there was any danger of this species becoming exterminated, the fisherman said they were becoming scarce, and he thought something should be done to preserve them, as they were a valuable fish, especially as they come at a season when there are no other salmon.

There is not likely to be a great many engaged in the steelhead fishery this year, as nearly all the fishermen on the river are engaged in catching sturgeon for the eastern market. There are not less than 400 men between Cape Horn and Cathlamet fishing for sturgeon; some of them are fishing in the usual way with barbed hook and bait, but others are using what is called the Chinook hook, which has no barb and requires no bait, and is quite as saving as a hook with bait, costing 5 cents per pound, and a large quantity is used. The Chinook hook has a square bend, and are made as sharp as needles. They are strung along close together in lines, which are kept a short distance from the bottom by floats. The fish come swimming along near the bottom and run against these floats, and are caught on one, in their struggles get sometimes several more stuck in them.

The sturgeon and steel heads are both in good demand for shipping east, and the fishermen are likely to make more money in the winter than they do during the summer.—Oregonian, 15.
