AFTER the heathen are converted it might be well to bring them over to do a little missionary work in our cities.

The death of Jefferson Davis, leaves the venerable Hannibal Hamlin, of Maine, the only survivor of the members of the United States senate of 1848.

The government of the United States is the largest single patron of the railroads in the country. It is now paying \$20,000,000 a year for its railway mail service.

LARGE deposits of ice, believed by some to be relics of the glacial period in this country, have been discovered in Idaho. It is proposed to form companies to mine this ice for sale.

CLAUDE MEERER, a newspaper reporter, has been appointed private secretary of governor Campbell of Ohio. The chances are that before the time expires he will be so badly clawed by the politicians that he will be even a weaker man than he is now.

A TYPICALLY ignorant juryman has been found in Iowa. He could name only eight states of the Union and three presidents. He was firmly of the opinion that England is in Africa and that Canada is "out somewhere beyond California." Of course he takes no newspaper.

ROSAZZA MACKAY's modest young son has determined upon his career and picked out his office. He expects as soon as he has finished his studies to come to New York, enter into active political life, and tell his friends that, with his father's influence and his own ability, he will be sure to reach the presidency some day.

In relation to present activity in real estate one thing is not to be overlooked: the little sales at present of \$5,000 or \$10,000, or \$20,000, don't amount to anything; when eastern capitalists get wind of the possibilities here, the tremendous advantages of this locality, they will begin to invest; and then, \$250,000, and \$500,000 purchases will be in order.

JEFFERSON DAVIS, ex-president of the southern confederacy, died in New Orleans yesterday morning, in the 82nd year of his age, having been born June 3, 1808, the same year that Abraham Lincoln was born. For nearly a quarter of a century he has been a memory, and in his demise passes away one of the central figures in the great drama that was played to the death, nearly a generation ago.

ASSISTANT attorney general Shields of the interior department has given the secretary an opinion in regard to the repeal of the pre-emption laws by the enabling act. He holds that the intent was not to repeal the entire law, but only the eighth section of the law of 1841. He also holds that if the intent of congress was to repeal the pre-emption act it would have repealed the sections of the revised statutes of 1865.

SENOR CALTO, of the Argentine Republic is enthusiastic in praise of the recent Pan-American grand tour. Said he the other day: "Ah, we could not find fault with anything in that grand and interesting trip—it was perfect. If we complained we would deserve to be called—what do you call those people who are always finding fault, and who complain and grumble and make themselves disagreeable? Ah, what do you call them—these people? Yes, yes—sanguinums. If we found fault with anything on that grand trip we would deserve to be called sanguinums."

The constitution of Washington requires that all voters shall be citizens of the United States. That is no person of foreign birth can vote upon mere declaration of his intention to become a citizen. He can vote only upon attaining citizenship, five years after such declaration. It is provided, however, that all persons who were voters at the time of the adoption of the constitution shall still be electors. Under this constitution it will not be possible for political committees to grind out grist of foreign born voters for an election near at hand, and every man of foreign birth will have to wait till he has had an opportunity to know something about the duties of citizenship before he can vote in Washington.
