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England Threatening Portugal.
Lisbon, Jan. 7.—Salisbury's latest note was of a menacing, peremptory character, requiring Portugal to act at once, as if the rectitude of England's position in the case was beyond all doubt. It is believed Portugal cannot concede so much, but that the foreign minister will intimate the willingness of the Portuguese to order maintenance of the status quo in Africa, pending investigation, if England will do the same.
LONDON, Jan. 7.—The admiralty yacht *Euchantress* sailed from Portsmouth for Gibraltar to-day with several officers for the ironclads *Benbow* and *Colossus*. There is thought to be no doubt that the orders relate to Portugal.
ZANZIBAR, Jan. 7.—The British war ship *Kingfisher* has sailed from here, under severe orders. It is supposed her destination is Mozambique. The British cruisers *Calliope* and *Satellite* have arrived.

Death of the Dowager German Empress.
BERLIN, Jan. 7.—Dowager Empress Augusta died at 4:30 P. M., of influenza. The emperor and empress and their two eldest sons, crown prince William and prince Frederick, and the grand duchess of Baden, son-in-law and daughter respectively of the dowager empress, were at her bedside. Count von Moltke was much affected.
The deceased was married June 11th, 1829, to William the First, emperor of Germany, and was then known as the Duchess Marie Louise Anguste Katharine of Saxe-Weimar. She had two children by emperor William, viz: Frederick William, the late emperor of Germany, and the princess Louise, the present grand duchess of Baden.

Notice is hereby given that by virtue of a warrant issued by the auditor and police judge of the city of Astoria, in accordance with an order made by the common council of the city of Astoria, by ordinance number 1138, entitled an ordinance ordering the auditor and police judge to issue warrants for the collection of assessments remaining unpaid on the Washington street sewer assessment, approved Nov. 29th, 1889. Said warrant bearing date the 29th day of November, 1889, commanding me to levy upon lot number 2 in block number 40 in the city of Astoria, as laid out and recorded by John McClure, to collect an assessment of \$65, which assessment was made for the construction of a sewer in Washington street, between the south side of Astor street and 100 feet north of the north side of Water street, by ordinance No. 1100, entitled an ordinance declaring the probable cost of constructing a sewer in Washington street from the north side of Astor street to one hundred feet north of the north side of Water street, approved July 25th, 1889. I have this day levied upon lot number 2 in block number 40 in the city of Astoria, as laid out and recorded by John McClure, to collect an assessment of \$65, which assessment was made for the construction of a sewer in Washington street, between the south side of Astor street and one hundred feet north of the north side of Water street, by ordinance number 1100, entitled an ordinance declaring the probable cost of constructing a sewer in Washington street from the north side of Astor street to one hundred feet north of the north side of Water street, approved July 25th, 1889. 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
