

THE RECEDING WATERS.

The Willamette Flood Partly Subside

ALBANY, Feb. 7.—The river has fallen four and one-half feet at this city. Business, which has been parcity. Business, which has been par-alyzed by the flood, is being resumed. The damage to property in Albany is slight. It includes only a few old buildings, a portion of the old Mon-tieth mills and the Union Pacific wharf, besides damage from inunda-tion of basements. Several county bridges are gone and a considerable amount of stock was drowned along the river.

EUGENE CITY, Feb. 6.—The river falling slowly. The highest mark reached was twenty-two feet above Highest low water. The large bridge near Springfield went out Monday; also a part of the bridge near this city, enailing a loss of \$20,000. A few small buildings in the low bottoms were washed away, and a large amount of cordwood, fencing and other material, also, the aggregate losses figuring many thousand dellars. The city of Eugene did not suffer any loss from the river, and but slight loss and anoyance from surface water.




