Sues the Baronoff Packing Company.

H. N. Nice, formerly master of the steamer Baronoff, has filed in the United States district court a libel against the owners of the vessel and also the Baronoff Packing company. He alleges that he entered into an agreement with the owners in February, 1889, to proceed to Portland and take charge of the vessel for the season, his duties to consist in carrying the salmon packed by the company to places of shipment. He was to receive as compensation \$1,200 and 3 cents for each case of salmon packed. He alleges that he faithfully performed his duties and was entitled to \$1,236, but on demanding his pay only also the Baronoff Packing company. \$1,396, but on demanding his pay only received \$396.
