A CHANGE from the system of donta business which land commissioner Sparks put into effect during the last administration will be soon ordered by the secretary of the interior. It will come in the shape of an order sucpending and revoking Sparks' order which required special inspection to report on the surveys before flay were accepted by the government. It will allow the report of the conveyor general of public lands to stand or cepted by proof that the work is done and the ourveyors entitled to their pay.
