A Decision on the Prohibitory Law Which Pleases Them.

Leavenweath, Kan., March 3.-Judge Crozier, of the first judicia district of Kansas, in the trial of : drusgist before him charged with via lating the prohibitory law, rendered decision to-day that puts a new planon the liquor question in this state The assistant attorney general for this county a few week began proceedings against druggists in this city druggists them forfeit their pe mits to sell intoxicating liquor, and thave permanent restraining injunctions issued against them. The race greatly alarmed them at the time, but they got together and resolved to ter the law as it applied to their cases
Accordingly one of their number, Ed
ward Fritche, was brought te
trial to-day, and the evidence in his case showed clearly that he had not required parties to make an affidavit before selling them liquor, and that he had violated the law in several other points. The judge renered a lengthy decision in the cain which he went over all the probit itory laws passed in the several state be quoted from the decision judge Brewer and others. He fused to grant the injunction, and s the only way proceedings could be in stituted against druggists for violatin the law was by the same method : was taken against common soloon-keepers or jointists. He also held that when a person came to a druggist and got liquor under false preten-tions they were the ones to be prose-cuted and not the druggists. Certain ections of the law that relates to druggists, he says, are unconstitu-tional, and the following are his quo as and opinion on it:

"If the druggist has reason to be lieve that it is not for the purpose of nent specified, he must not set This makes him a physician. He must not sell to minors. He must to drunken men. He must have a good nose. Nor to a person in the habit of getting intoxicated. He must know the family history of the applicant. The druggist is put in a separate class. He is liable on his bond where druggists have a lawful permit, and he is punishable by fine nd imprisonment, but he is not pun ishable by an injunction and the en The decision is received with grea

joy by the druggists who will no proceed to sell liquor in carnest.
