In view of the proceedings at the Republican meeting last evening, and the primaries to be held to-morrow, THE ASTORIAN suggests that it would be a good idea for the convention called for the 9th of April to confine itself on that date to the selection of seven delegates to the Republican state convention, and postpone the nomination of a county ticket till the first week in May.

It also suggests that there are not enough Republicans in Clatsop county to make two Republican parties; there are enough to make things prosperous for one Republican party.

Democratic fights are like cat fights; they always result in more cats; Republican fights do not augment party strength to any satisfactory degree.

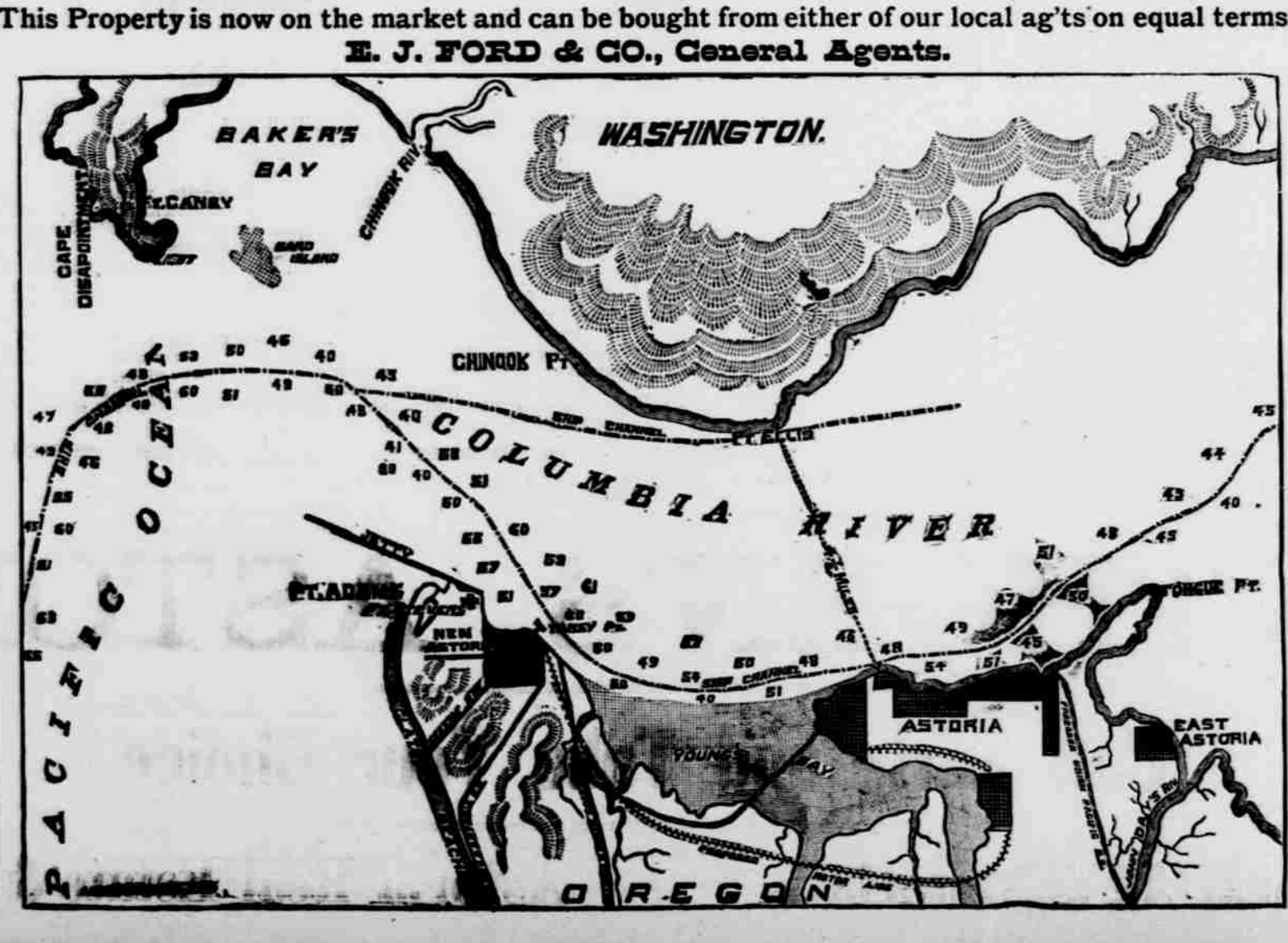
