The opening of Portland's new hotel is just cause for congratulation to the citizens of our sister city, whose enterprise has made possible so substantial an indication of metropolitan activity. The new hotel is a splendid advertisement of and for Portland, and is in every way a good investment.

That was a brave sight yesterday in the Court street school yard yesterday afternoon. A fine schoolhouse; from its open doors orderly files of children marching to the music of the drum to plant trees in the yard; from the flag pole on the tower the stars and stripes rising and falling as its folds caught the glory of the sunlight; from the little throats of the children a strain of melody; the whole forming fit emblem of our country and the younger and grander army of the republic.

The platform of the State Union party adopted at Oregon City last Wednesday appears to be a general dumping ground for all the theories, ideas, facts and notions that float through the brains of impracticable people. It has some things in it that commend themselves to respectful attention, but their strength is dissipated, their truth discredited by their appearance in such a jumble of crude imaginings. If our "Union" party friends would concentrate their fire they would do better. Their shot scatters too much.

Twenty-nine years to-day since Sumner was fired on. How far off it all seems, when viewed through the haze and mist of many years! The uprising of the north the march of millions; the shock of conflict; the blood and treasure so freely sacrificed; the four years of fratricidal strife; the tragedy of the nation; the close of the terrible war. Our piping times of peace seem dull and petty compared with the deeds of those dead days. Pray Heaven that the American people may never again pass through so fiery and trying an ordeal.

It is with pleasure THE ASTORIAN learns that first-assistant postmaster general Clarkson is coming out here to take notes on the way the post office service is administered on the Pacific coast. He will find much to suggest and improve and considerable to condemn. Clarkson is an old newspaper man, and knows the needs of newspapers and their trouble when the postal service is held back by cast iron rules formulated by officials at the national capital who have no conception of the needs of the day, or the demands of progress. His visit will do good.

Everywhere will be found a communication from a resident, regarding the present status of the salmon situation, which is conservative and timely. In all discussion of this matter it must be borne in mind that there is no actual difference of opinion and no antagonism between the cannery and the fishermen. As a matter of fact, the cannery men are just as eager to get salmon as the fishermen are to furnish them, and are desirous to pay as high a price as possible, as a matter of competition. The whole matter is a question of competition between Alaska and the Columbia river. The Columbia river cannery men are perforce compelled to pack, but cannot take hold unless they see a prospect of at least coming out even at the close of the season. The question, like all pocket questions, will regulate itself, the final solution resting largely on the developments of the next few weeks in the salmon market.
