NECESSARY LEGISLATION.

The three members from Clatsop, at the next meeting of the legislature, will have an opportunity to aid in some wholesome legislation, not only for this city, but for the entire state.

Foremost among legislative needs is the repeal of the present swindle known as the "exemption of indebtedness." This ancient fraud exists only by sufferance. It has no adequate reason for existence; it is condemned by everybody whose opinion is worth baving, and is a detriment to the state's best interests and is a positive injustice to seven out of ten of the taxpayers of the state.

Before and during the last session of the legislature THE ASTORIAN made an effort to secure the repeal of this iniquitous measure. A bill to so repeal it passed the house by a good majority; then it went to the senate; there it was smothered in the committee room. It never saw the light again. A political boss who is no more got the credit of this job. A man who would prostitute his position as chairman of a state central committee to put a tool of his on the state supreme bench, is not above strangling a healthy legislative infant, if it gave promise of annoyance of his financial associates.

We look for better results from the next legislature, and to see a bill put through both houses that will wipe out this menace to the property of the poor man, and thus do tardy justice to the great majority of the tax payers of the state.

The way to have this result brought about is to have the candidates for the legislature pledge themselves that if elected they will vote and work for the repeal of that odious clause permitting the allowance of indebtedness in the state to make up the tax list.
