 CHARTER AMENDMENTS.

ASTORIA needs some legislation at Salem next winter, and the time is not too far off to speak of some of it now. The charter needs several alterations and amendments. At present the mayor has no vote; in case of a tie he should have a vote in the council. The municipal restriction should be removed, and the city allowed to issue bonds for the building of a sea wall. Economy demands this. Economy is only another name for good management. In our individual private affairs there are times when it is economy to save ten cents. There are times when it is good economy to spend a thousand dollars. This is one of the times when true economy demands the expenditure of money.

Then, too, the manner of keeping our streets in repair needs adjustment. The Astorian believes that the best interests of the city require that the streets shall be kept in repair by expenditure from the general fund, and not as at present, at the expense of the adjacent property holders.

The charter of 1876 was a good charter for that time. But the clothes of an infant cannot fit with comfort the limbs of a growing youth.

The Seattle *Post-Intelligencer* says that "all over the state of Washington little clusters of cabins are being hung together into 'mush-room cities,' with 'suburbs' of 'extensions' innumerable, heralded by inflaming prospectuses as 'terminals' or 'centers' for untold wealth and impossible railroad connections, or as 'harbors,' which have, in fact, no advantages over other localities."

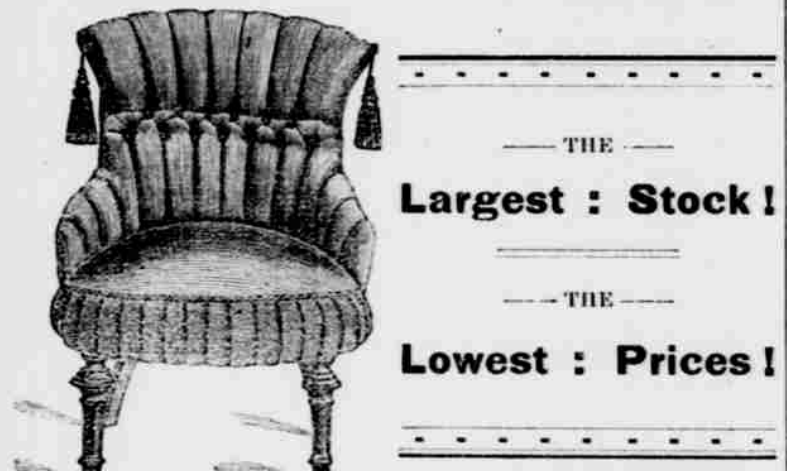
