Remarkable Record of Presidential Pat-
ronage.
Within a period of six months presi-
dent Harrison will have commended

gave him a third chance and colonel
Grierson was raised to the rank of
brigadier-general. The fourth of the
series of nominations came with the
retirement of quartermaster-general
S. B. Holabird June 16th. On July 1st
another retirement for age will oc-
cur—that of commissary-general Hor-
ace Maceley. The sixth appointment
of a general officer will occur just one
week later, when brigadier-general B.
H. Grierson reaches the age of sixty-
four. Then the seventh of the pre-
sent series will be due on the 16th of
August, when surgeon-general John
Morrow will fall a victim to the ropy
prescribing retirement for age. These
seven nominations of general officers,
occurring within a period of six
months, make up an exceptional record.
