Concomity Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, propose to order the improvement of Concomity street, in the city of Astoria, as laid out and recorded by John McClure, from the east side of Main street to the west side of said Concomity street, by filling and grading the same to its established grade to its full width, and by replanking the same to its full width (where plank is not already in good condition) with new and sound fir plank four inches in thickness, and by building sidewalks on both sides thereof, where deemed necessary; and unless remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property fronting on said street be filed with the Auditor and Police Judge within ten days of the final publication of this notice, to wit: on or before Saturday, August 23rd, 1890, the Common Council will order said improvements made.
