A Curious Idol.

Among a collection of Burmese, Indian and Japanese curiosities, recently sold in London, was "The Hindu Lingam God, consisting of a chrysolite cat's eye fixed in a topaz, and mounted in a pyramidal base studded with diamonds and precious stones. This curious relic stood 2 1/2 inches in height. It was preserved for more than a thousand years in an ancient temple at Delhi, where acts of devotion were paid before it by the women anxious to have children. The base is of solid gold, and around it are set nine gems of charms, a diamond, ruby, sapphire, chrysolite cat's eye, coral pearl, hyacinth garnet, yellow emerald and emerald. These gems are all richly carved, and would not doubt by more scientific cutting be greatly improved in value. Round the apex of this gold pyramid is a plinth set with diamonds. On the apex is a topaz 1/2 inch in length and 1/4 inch wide and 9-16 of an inch in depth, shaped like a horseshoe; in the center of the horseshoe the great chrysolite cat's eye stands in height. This is 15-16 of an inch in height and dark brown in color, and shaped like a pear. An extremely mobile opalescent light crosses the length of the stone in an oblique direction. When Bad Shah Bahadur Shah, the last king of Delhi, was captured and exiled to the Andaman Isles, his queen secreted this gem, and it has never seen again until, being dispossessed during the mutiny, she sold it to the present owner. The gem brought \$12,250.
