There have been some very severe volcanic disturbances this summer on the Ounimak Islands, and the natives there are frightened out of their wits. It is the opinion of sealing men that these disturbances have had the effect of changing the haunts of the minute animalculæ on which the seals feed, and in consequence the seals themselves have gone further to the west-ward. This theory is in part estab-lished by the fact that the catch of seals on the Caffer Islands has been much greater this season than form-

Coming out of Ounimak pass on the 21st of August, the Adele sighted the Victorian schooners Kate and Ariel, both bound home. She saw nothing of the schooner Lily, and has heard nothing of her from any of the other


