ASTORIA, OREGON: FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 1890. SHIPPERS are feeling rather blue in regard to the present outlook for business, especially in San Francisco, as indicated by a telegram from that city published in our dispatches this morning.

UNNATURAL indeed seems the strange message from Ottawa, where a young woman seeks to murder her younger sister and her aged mother, who was helpless and bed-ridden, simply to gratify a spirit of revenge.

HARBOR lines for Astoria are to be settled by the eminent officers of the United States engineer corps, who compose the board to decide the matter. Col. Mendell, Major Handbury and Capt. Symons are the officials who meet to-day in the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce. Any and all citizens interested, who have any suggestions to offer, should meet with the board.

TELEGRAMS from San Francisco show that the Pacific Coast Chamber of Commerce is actively at work on matters of general interest, and from the stability, energy and well known determined character of the gentlemen present, there is every reason to believe that the result of their deliberations will be highly beneficial to the best interests of all the states represented at that gathering.

CONGRESSMEN seem to be aroused at last, and having become aware of the pernicious effects of that personification of rascality, the Louisiana Lottery, are doing their best to place upon its nefarious business the stamp of national disapproval. The anti-lottery bill has passed both branches of Congress and now awaits the signature of President Harrison, which is sure to be readily given. Hundreds of men have been ruined financially by continued investments in lottery tickets, and if it can be prevented from extending its blighting influence all over this broad land, a grand object will have been attained.

A COMMUNICATION on the local page from a correspondent contains much that is worthy of consideration regarding the future requirements of this city as to facilities for railroads along its water front. It is evident that if Astoria ever has railroads to bring hither the products of the rich and extensive country to the eastward, some provision must be made for delivering freight to the vessels that shall lie at her wharves. Perhaps consideration of this matter may not be overlooked by members of our chamber of commerce when discussing matters relating to the water frontage of the city.

NEWSPAPER men have many and various ways of acquiring information regarding current events, and no matter how closely parties interested may try to keep news to themselves the average reporter can generally ascertain the facts if he tries. Seldom is there a star chamber transaction but what the reporters gain the particulars and publish the news to an expectant public.
