When a man has his business in perfect working order, and knows that just then, a little more or a little less effort on his part will be answered by increased or decreased profits, it is hard for him to believe it wise for him to leave his duties for an hour, even though he is overworked. But one of the highest duties a man owes himself is to give his brain an occasional rest.

Do not imagine that your business will go to the dogs if you leave it for a day or two. If you have been thorough with your men—if you have faithful and interested employees—the machine will jog along smoothly enough until you return. We are apt to flatter ourselves that we are doing what no other person could do; but, not infrequently, something happens to show us that we are not nearly as indispensable as we imagined—in fact, that a division of labor in our business would be vastly to its advantage.

Business is a master that soon makes subject slaves of us if we will; but, with a well established trade, one should be master of his business. With probity, industry, and economy, almost any man, by well directed effort, may be prosperous. Whatever progress is made without this foundation is deceptive.

Every citizen of Astoria should take pride in the Chamber of Commerce, and every business or professional man who cares to advance the interests of the city should be a member of that body. When public men like John Tweeddale, chief clerk of the war department, and Senator Washburn come here they are entertained by the Chamber of Commerce and the few members of that body foot the bills while the city gets the credit of entertaining them. Therefore every man who cares for the welfare of Astoria should be a member of that body.

Strenuous efforts are being made by the Pittsburg Chamber of Commerce to secure in that city the location of some of the big Welsh tin companies. The McKinley bill, now in operation as a law, shuts out the Welsh product, and it is believed that they will pack up their plants and bring them over and set up in business. That might be the center of the tin-plate industry and has all the advantages and resources to make it so, if the people will only make the proper effort to advertise the fact.
