

The Population of the United States Is 62,480,540. Special to THE ASTORIAN.]

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.-A bulletin issued to-day on the population of the United States says: The population of the United States on June 1st 1890. as shown by a first count, exclusive of whites in Indian territory, Indians on the reservations and in Alaska, is 62,-480,540. These figures may be slightly changed by later computations.

In 1880 the population was 50,155,-783. The absolute increase in ten years is 12,324,750; percentage of increase is 24.57. In 1870 the population was stated at 38,558,371. According to these figures the absolute in-crease between 1870 and 1880 was 11,crease between 1870 and 1880 was 11, 587,412, the percentage of increase be-

ing 30.08.

Upon their face these figures show that the population has increased between 1880 and 1890 only 727,345 more than between 1870 and 1880, while the rate of increase has apparently diminished from 80.08 to 24.75 per cent. 


