It don't take much to console the Seattle Telegraph, judging from the following: "Amid the gloom which hangs over the local election returns, it is cheering to cast the eye towards the shining light which illumines West Seattle. We elected a constable over there. All is not lost."

A SPEAK OF war is hovering over the horizon, in consequence of the action of the British government in so strongly fortifying stations on the West India islands. Jamaica, St. Lucia and Bermuda are being made strong citadels, with large garrisons of troops and heavy armaments. As complete preparations for defense are being made as if they expected to be attacked in a few weeks, and what the motive is that prompts this action appears to be a mystery to the people of this country. Separate cable communications are being made with the islands, independent of the American lines, and everything indicates that their expected enemy will be the United States.

CONSIDERABLE anxiety is being manifested in political circles in regard to the next speaker of the house of representatives, as well as to who will be the democratic nominee for the next president of the United States. It is rumored that efforts will be made to give the speaker to the west, if western men will work for an eastern man for president. Hill, Whitney and Cleveland are evidently in the lead, and each man has many followers who would be glad to seat him in the chair of chief magistrate of the nation. That the next speaker will be a democrat, is a foregone conclusion, but that the next president will be a democrat, is not by any means certain; in fact, it is extremely doubtful in the minds of those who have closely watched the political horizon for many years.

MANY people are evidently unaware how strict the law is, with regard to preventing any writing or printing on the inside of envelopes which shall in any way be calculated to reflect discreditably on the person to whom the letter may be addressed. A decision in a case of this kind was recently made by Judge Wheeler, of the United States district court of the district of Vermont, which is interesting. The court held that the act was violated by sending through the mail letters contained in envelopes bearing the words "Executive Collection Agency" printed in large letters across the upper half of the envelope. The printed words were separate from the direction to return if not called for, in the lower left-hand corner, and the court held that they were obviously placed so as to attract attention and reflect disrepute in making payment upon the persons to whom the envelopes were sent.
