CANDIDATES for councilmen from the First and Second wards are now before the people, both parties having made their nominations. The election takes place next Wednesday and as the parties are all well known, every citizen has undoubtedly already decided who he will vote for on that day. They are all good men and it is not likely that the interests of the city would suffer in the hands of either two of them.

KING KALAKAUA is receiving a right royal welcome in San Francisco, where officials and citizens are vying with each other as to who shall accord him the greater honor. In return the dusky representative of island royalty is dispensing favors by creating knights of his kingdom as marks of royal favor for courtesies rendered. Thus visitor and host are mutually happy, and the event will furnish that lively city its temporary share of necessary excitement.

ESTIMATES were published in these columns two weeks ago to-day in accordance with a telegram in the same issue, showing the political complexion of the fifty-second congress, as compiled in the office of the clerk of the house. That has been carefully revised and the telegraph now reports that the lower house will have 88 republicans, 234 democrats, 8 alliance, 1 uncertain, and 1 vacant, making 332 in all.

MOST heartily THE ASTORIAN endorses the petition for the establishment of a new postoffice on the Lewis and Clarke, as indicated by their statement in another column. At present the residents in that vicinity are seriously inconvenienced with the condition of the postal service, and the department will do an act of justice if they grant the petition, and order the establishment of the office. It is hard for the authorities at Washington to understand the rapid growth of settlements on this coast and the necessity for new offices often developed in a comparatively short space of time.

ALMOST every citizen will admit that the plan proposed by the committee of the Oregon Press Association is a good one; that is to have each county appoint a commissioner, and the city of Portland five, and these thirty-six shall have charge of the exhibit of this state at the world's fair at Chicago, including the disbursement of the funds which may be appropriated by the state at large or by the respective counties, or from any other source. This certainly is an equitable proposition which will be the best calculated to secure a fair and impartial display of the products of the whole state, and one which is likely to meet with general approval. The circular letter of the press committee is printed in another column.
