Politics in South Carolina appears to be undergoing a change, judging by the report of the election of a new senator to succeed Wade Hampton, where a young reformer has been chosen.

Stranger of all the strange tales of shipwreck and suffering at sea, is the telegraphic report published this morning, of the trials and sufferings of a crew on board a ship on the Black sea. Some of the statements are scarcely possible.

Government vessels built on the Atlantic do not seem to be as successful as those constructed on this coast. A case in point is the cruiser Newark which has just made a second and unsuccessful trial trip. As soon as she is repaired a third attempt to achieve success will be made.

Astoria will not be very likely to have a railroad unless her citizens pay for it themselves, or give nearly enough in land or property, to reimburse some other parties for the cost of its construction. Even then it would be a good investment for the citizens, as a railroad is cheap at any price.

Immediately upon the completion of a railroad from here to the Willamette valley and a connection with the three main lines in Oregon, the value of real estate here would be increased from two to three times its present valuation, and such an impetus would be given as would soon make this one of the most prominent and rapidly growing cities on the Pacific coast. The donation of one-quarter, or one-third of the property of the entire city, if it would secure a railroad, would prove to be a highly profitable investment. It therefore follows that if unity of action could be had the citizens of Astoria alone could build a railroad.

Whatever the future of Astoria shall be during the coming year which is so quickly to dawn upon us depends more upon the action of our citizens than upon any or all outside influences. There is no excellence without great labor, and the man or city who desires success, must expect to work for it. Fortunes are not thrown to idle writers, who sit down quietly and anticipate the favors of the fickle goddess to be poured into their upturned baskets. Millionaires are not hunting for hives of drones where they may unsuspected give away fortunes. We must work to win, and when we show a desire to help ourselves, we may then reasonably anticipate assistance.
