Satisfactory Postal Efficiency.

Very satisfactory results are re-corded by Postmaster-General Wansmaker in his annual report. The gross evenue of the postal service is nearly 85,000,000 larger than ever before S5,000,000 larger than ever before. Nearly 5,000 new postoffices, more than in any one year before, have been established upon the petitions of communities which needed them. A decreasing limit for the extension of the free delivery system has permitted the employment of letter carriers in over offix towns, and three times. employment of letter carriers in over fifty towns, and three times as many sub-stations and stamp agencies were established as during the previous year. The star-route mileage has increased over 5,000,000 miles, and the railroad mileage over 11,000,000 miles. The number of pieces sent to the dead letter office has been reduced by 2,000,000, and the office expects that by encouraging postmasters in free delivery cities to prepare supplementary directories prepare supplementary directories and by general suggestions to the public through the newspapers to take greater care in the direction of matter, its labors will be reduced by at least

A Long Distance Telephone.

The long distance telephone line be-tween Vienna and Prague has been in operation for a little over a year, and the success of the line has been so satisfactory that another is to be installed very shortly. During the year there have been 38,857 conversations, 16,464 being calls from Prague to Vienna, and 22,333 from Vienna for Prague. The total receipts for the year were close on \$20,000. 


