The Salmon Combine Goes Through.

The salmon cannerymen who have been in session for the last two days in this city and in Portland, some time ago, in a vain endeavor to form a combination, have at last come to a conclusion and arranged matters to the satisfaction of all parties.

The main objects of the combination are to govern the selling price of fish and to prevent the indiscriminate sale by men under contract to the canneries to outside buyers.

Regarding the number of canneries that will be run, and the maximum output of fish for the year, nothing has as yet been decided, but it is generally understood that the canneries to be operated this year will be all those that were running last year, and no limit is to be placed on the output.
