The crime was next to murder, the worst known to the law, and as it was committed under such revolting circumstances, he did not think the punishment provided by law was any too strong and he therefore sentenced him to the full penalty of twenty years imprisonment.

About 9 o'clock last night a hospital attendant got a little information from him. He said his name was Samuel D—, and that he came some weeks ago from New Brunswick. The last few days his head has felt queer, and he has been wandering about the city, not knowing which way to turn. What impelled him to commit his rash act he was unable to say.
