Section 1.-In all school districts in this state with a population of one thousand and upwards, any citizen of the state shall be entitled to vote at a school meeting who is twenty-one (21) years of age and has resided in the district thirty (30)-days immediately preceeding the meeting, and who has property in the district upon which he or she pays a tax.
