TODAY'S WEATHER.

Portland, March 29.—For Oregon and Washington, Light rain. Local weather for the twenty-four hours ending at 5 p. m., yesterday, furnished by the U. S. department of agriculture, weather bureau:

The public sentiment of the country is against the private armed forces,

best known as the Pinkertons, and has condemned them so that they may be no more resorted to; but this does not mean that crowds of strikers shall at their pleasure interrupt thoroughfares and destroy property.

The organized or unorganized workmen has the right to quit employment when to do so is not in itself an act of malicious destructiveness, but no man has a right to refuse work, and then refuse to permit others to do that work.
