THE COLUMBIA ROUTE.

The Oregonian concedes, very amiably, that part of the Inland Empire wheat will go to the Sound for shipment. Our contemporary is losing its old-time fire and energy. In its yesterday. to retain its hold on public favor in Washington, the Oregonian loses sight of the true interests of Oregon. All Oregon should take the position that the Columbia route is the best outlet for the grain of the Inland Empire. Before state boundaries were determined or railroads were constructed, nature had designated the great river as the best means of communication for a watershed whose area is equal to one-sixth of the area of the United States.

When the facilities which the majestic river provides are supplemented by railroads, and the projected improvements at the cascades and dalles are completed, Oregon and Washington will have a system of transportation unexcelled by any in the world. The proposed railroad from Portland to Astoria will be a primary factor in that system. Without that railroad, the Willamette valley and the grain fields of Eastern Oregon and Washington will lack the full advantages which the Columbia with its deep fresh water harbor at Astoria provides. Our Portland contemporary should keep this primary fact in mind and not be mistled into giving undue importance to the Sound and its railroads.
