OUR DAILY MARINE COLUMN

MARINE ETAOI ETOINETAINE The steamer Elmore will be in today. She was delayed two days by stress of weather at Tillamook bar.

The British bark Amuree, hence with grain for Falmouth for orders, is discharging at Liverpool.

The steamer Columbia sailed for San Francisco yesterday morning. She made but a short stay here on her arrival from Portland.

The bark Kitty has been chartered to load lumber at Wedder's Mill. The destination was stated yesterday to be China.

The British bark Seaforth is due to leave down today from Portland.

The British barks Highland Home and Oakbank have almost finished loading.

The British steamer Danby arrived yesterday morning, having anchored near Fort Stevens the previous night. She was stopped at a point nearly opposite the Seaside cannery in order that her passengers might be inspected and her bill of health looked into. There was no sickness found on board with the exception of one case of brain fever among the Chinese. From the manner in which the certificates were made out, it is thought that many of the holders will be returned. The same handwriting figures on about two hundred of them, and it is more than likely that wholesale forgery has been committed by some one.

In speaking of the coolies, Collector Taylor stated that "they were the rawest lot that ever came to an American port." He considers that not more than one in twenty is entitled to admission into the United States.

Not more than six of the entire 624 can speak the English language, and the great majority of them are from the lowest class of Hong Kong laborers.

The steamer Bandorille, Captain Winant, arrived in yesterday from Coquille River. She proceeded to Portland later in the day.

The British ship Foyledale, Captain Tait, was spoken on the 24th ult. in latitude 50 north, longitude 15 west. She has probably arrived at her destination.


