Accepting the gold certificates as the equivalent of gold, the aggregate of gold was \$308,-682,999.16. Of greenbacks, there was \$26,873,899, preferred to metal by many. These added to the actual gold on hand, and the gold certificates, make an aggregate of \$334,955,898, cash on hand, not counting the \$15,000,000 of silver certificates and treasury notes of 1890, or the \$481,788,691.44 of silver. 
