#### TODAY'S WEATHER.

Portland, Or., For Oregon and Wash ington: Occasional light rain; slightly

Local weather for the twenty-four hours ending at 5 p. m., yesterday furnished by the U.S. Department of Ariculture, weather bureau.

Maximum temperature, 53 degrees Minimum temperature, 47 degrees. Precipitation, .72 inch.

Total precipitation from July 1, 1892, to date, \$1.06 inches,

Excess of precipitation from July 1, 1892, to date, 9.13 Inches.

The records of the U.S. Weather Bureau of this city show some interesting comparisons between the present month of May and the same month of previous years. Thus far, the month, like its predecessor April, has abnormal features. The temperature, while lower than the normal, does not pre sent such contrasts as the rainfall, Rain has fallen sixteen out of nine teen days of the month. The normal rainfall for the whole month is but 2.93 inches, while up to date during the present month, 4.84 inches have fallen. Since the establishment of the weather bureau in this city in 1883, this amount has only once been exceeded by the total rainfall for an entire month of May. This occurred in May, 1887, when 7.33 inches fell during the month. As the winter and spring of that year presented many characteristics similar to the same seasons of the present year, and were followed by a fine, dry summer, we may reasonably hope that "Old Probabilities" will
