TODAY'S WEATHER. Portland, Or., June 1.—For Oregon and Washington: Continued fair weather.

Local weather for the twenty-four hours ending at 5 p. m., yesterday, furnished by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, weather bureau. Maximum temperature 73 degrees. Minimum temperature 48 degrees.

Last night's meeting of property owners at the Chamber of Commerce rooms pretty thoroughly demonstrated their views on the subject of excessive taxation.

Under the present current system President Cleveland has autocratic powers. If he were to direct that silver certificates be redeemed in silver, he could disturb the whole commercial and banking business of the country.

Portland holds her charter election tomorrow. The lines are straightly drawn, there being no "citizens" ticket in the field.

It seems settled that congress will meet in October and that President Cleveland will force on its attention tariff revision and repeal of the Sherman law which compels the treasury to buy silver bullion monthly.


