TODAY'S WEATHER.

Portland, Or. June 8.—For Oregon and Washington: Fair weather; warm.

Local weather for the twenty-four hours ending at 5 p. m., yesterday, furnished by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, weather bureau. Maximum temperature, 60 degrees. Minimum temperature, 51 degrees. Precipitation, .11 inch. Total precipitation from July 1st, 1892, to date, 82.13 inches. Excess of precipitation from July 1st, 1892, to date, 8.06 inches.

The cannerymen are daily becoming more disturbed over the prospects for this season. They view with increasing alarm the continued scarcity of salmon, and many are now figuring on how to come out even by the 10th of August.
