TODAY'S WEATHER. Portland, June 19.—For Oregon and Washington: Fair weather. Local weather for the twenty-four hours ending at 5 p. m., yesterday, furnished by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, weather bureau.

The course pursued by Dr. Briggs is eliciting many strong words of approval from press and pulpit. In Portland, on Sunday, the Rev. H. V. 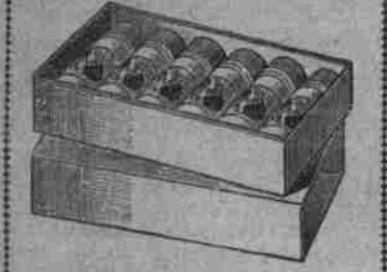
