MORE ABOUT MONEY.

In "Munera Pulveris," the distinguished author, John Ruskin, does more than indicate sound financial doctrine for the nations of the earth—he gives sound and intelligible definitions.

Money has inaccurately been spoken of as merely a means of exchange. But it is far more than this. It is a documentary expression of legal claim.

The expression here made use of to define money gave rise, on its first publication, to a contemptuous question: "Is half a crown a document?"

"Money is, therefore, correspondent in its nature to the title of an estate. Though the deed be burned, the estate still exists, but the right to it has become disputable."

It is not evident then, that the shape, oblong, square, or round; the material, paper, gold, or silver, have nothing to do with its power of exchange.

The real worth of money remains unchanged, as long as the proportion of the quantity of existing money to the quantity of existing wealth (intrinsic value) or available labor remains unchanged.

"Money, therefore cannot be arbitrarily multiplied, any more than title deeds can. So long as the existing wealth or available labor is not fully represented by the currency, the currency may be increased without diminution of the assigned worth of its pieces."

Why cannot our cleverest economists in congress comprehend that plain and simple fact? The American notes, coin or securities which go to Europe to be exchanged for luxuries or necessities, should not be considered as a diminution of the currency except in so far as such export represents a diminution of the real wealth of the land.

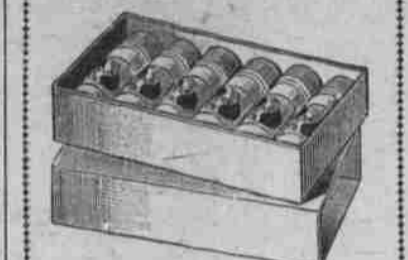
