NOT FISH ALONE.

It seems to have been easy enough, with traps and wheels, to drive the royal Chinook salmon away from the Columbia, as evidenced by the yearly leasing packs. Will it be as easy to lure them by abolishing the destructive agencies? Once diverted to other spawning grounds it is not likely there is either neglect or tradition in the fishy tribe to bring them back again.

Other sources of wealth must then be developed for the maintenance of the prosperity of the country along the banks of the great river; and the chances of fishing be supplanted by the certainties of lumbering mining and agriculture. Nor is the prospect discouraging. If there had never been one fish more than was needed for local consumption caught in the Columbia it would have been better for all the territory that skirts the river.

Here is one of the finest harbors of the world, and the exports, other than fish, which have passed the river bar sink the canning interest into insignificant. If the brawn and muscle of the hardy fishermen had been expended on clearing the forest clad hills, turning the trees into lumber, and compelling the soil to fruit and grain, the individual man and the country at large would have been vastly better off.

Attempt at Suicide.

While the walks in the Public Garden were crowded yesterday afternoon about 4:30 o'clock, people near the entrance gates at the corner of Beason and Charles streets were horrified to see a man suddenly plunge a knife repeatedly into his throat and fall to the ground.

While waiting for a conveyance an officer questioned the would-be suicide, who was about 50 years of age, as to his name, address, and reason for wishing to end his life, but the man steadfastly refused to give any information regarding himself. He was taken to the Massachusetts General Hospital and surgical attendance given him. Although weak from loss of blood it is probable he will recover. About 9 o'clock last night a hospital attendant got a little information from him. He said his name was Samuel D., and that he came some weeks ago from New Brunswick. The last few days his head has felt queer, and he has been wandering about the city, not knowing which way to turn. What impelled him to commit his rash act he was unable to say.

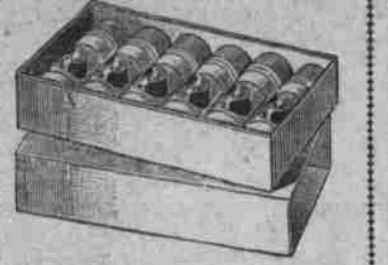
