NO MORE GOLD BONDS.

Bonds, bonds, bonds! The cry of

Restricting the legal tender limit of silver seems to be an absurd way of foreing subsidiary coin into circulation, even accepting its dependant scheme of putting out no paper money less than a five-dollar bill. We are told that the treasury has issued silver certificates for various sums, from one dollar to ten thousand, against stitutes for the coln. They are unrestricted legal tender, and pass from hand to hand with so great readiness that they are preferred to gold coin in the business of the country. If the coining machines were run to full capacity, and all the bar silver in the treasury vaults were stamped and stored, and silver certificates issued against it, the increase in the volume of currency would be some relief.
