We see that some of the newspapers are falling into raptures as the days pass on, over the president's message, As everybody anticipated he confined it to the single topic of stopping the purchase of silver. It was character istic of him to do so, following the precedent of his tariff message in 1887, The reply of the opponents of his pciley is also simple. It is that the answer to the demand that no more silver shall be bought is that all silver shall be free at the mints to be exincu into dollars, (legal tender) at the ratio

In their action the silver men are guided by their animosities and pride of opinion, and seem to have no knowledge of their interests. Their old theory that free colnage would make liver worth 129 cents per fine ounce has been annihilated by the experience of recent years. That which the Latin Union could not do we cannot, and when the price of silver declined while ed it at a rate sixteen times greater than ever before, and when we undertook to purchase all of it. doesn't it prove that free comage would not rehabilitate it as an American product, but throw upon us th surplus stock of Europe, and actually reduce the market value? We do not believe there is a particle of doubt that if free coinage were carried through congress, and over the president's veto, it would bring the dollar down to a purchasing power of to cents, Gold, it is our contention, would not be demonetized, but doubled in money capacity. Free coinage is the silver standard, and under it the gold dollar would be two dollars.

The silver men (outside the mere miners) do not want the price of silver to go up. It is their policy to make it the stindard, and then down the metal in the markets. That is precisely what free comage would do. and they know it; and that is why they are for it.

Socialistic repudiation is at the bottom of the sliver crusade. Free coinand is 50 per cent repudiation to be

Can ruybody dony white metal at a rate such that there is fifty per cent clear profit at the present market price? They are monometallists and monopolists, and an investi ention would expose them and check their calamity cries in their thronts.
