The Rev. Reuben Thomas, of Brookline, Mass., has recently come into possession of a valuable relic of the Rev. Richard Baxter, author of the famous book "The Reformed Christian's Rest." It is the old-fashioned chair used by the English divine while writing his treatise. When Baxter died it was placed in the Broad Street Congregational church of London, where it remained for nearly 200 years, until the building was torn down, when it came into possession of the last pastor, the Rev. William O'Neill, whose son inherited it and sent it to Dr. Thomas.

His name is John Spencer, and he is seventy years old, but he has not yet read any of his famous cousin's books. His son went to San Francisco in 1852, and says that though he and his cousin were playmates as boys, they have long since lost track of each other, and that the famous philosopher knows nothing about his present doings.
